TIMEKEEPER/SCOREKEEPER RULES

- 1. (2) 25-minute half's, with a 5-minute half-time break
- 2. Game should start no later than 15 minutes after the time slotted on the game schedules (so with a 1:30 time slot, the game should start no later than 1:45)
- 3. (2) 30-second time-out's per team, per half
- 4. 3-point field goals are allowed
- 5. Clock is to be run continuously, even during fouls shots, except for:
 - Timeout for player substitutions (every 5 minutes) or coach's timeout
 - Last 1 minute of the 1st half during foul shots
 - Last 5 minutes of the game (plus OT) during foul shots
 - Last 2 minutes of the game (plus OT) clock stops on every dead ball

FOULS

- Team fouls will be tracked "1 and 1" is awarded upon 7th team foul of the half, double bonus (2 shots) upon 10th team foul. In overtime, the fouls from the 2nd half are carried over.
- Personal fouls will be tracked. 5th foul = a technical foul, so 2 shots and possession of the ball (unless there is a made shot)

PLAYING RULES

- No defensive zones are allowed only man-to-man defense; double-teams are only allowed in the lane and below the top of the 3-point arc; defender must stay within 10 feet of his man, as long as that man is within the 3-point arc
- Backcourt defense is not allowed. During the last 2 minutes of the game, the defense is allowed in the backcourt ONLY for the purpose of giving an intentional foul any turnover caused by the defense in the backcourt is nullified.
- Players are rotated every 5 minutes of actual game time; each player plays the entire period no situational substitutions are allowed during a period
- If a player is injured during his rotation, then his replacement will not be charged with a rotation; however, it has to be an equitable replacement (i.e. a like size/skill player)
- No player can play 2 more or 2 less periods in a game than any other player on the team
- Youth referees will be used, and they are not to be "jockeyed" or harassed. A coach can ask for a reasonable explanation of a call, but the youth refs are not to yelled to or yelled at under any circumstances.
- Fighting can be cause for immediate ejection
- Any ejected player or coach is automatically suspended for his next game; if a player's relative is ejected from a game, then that player is suspended for his next game
